DEVELOPING AS A VISUAL ARTIST

Practice!!!

Some say it takes 10,000 hours to master a skill. Others describe it as "mileage" for your pencil to travel. So get started and keep it up!

BUT don't be intimidated or deterred by the endeavor. Enjoy gradual progress.

Build a foundation before getting caught up with software or style.

Focus on specific component skills one at a time, and then gradually bring them all together (skills include drawing, composition, lighting, color, gesture, design, characters, environments, specific tools/software)

Identify your strengths & weaknesses and target each in turn.

Inspiration

What work inspires you? What is similar to what you'd like to make? What represents what you do NOT want to do?

Community

You need both encouragement and challenge to keep growing and to be exposed to new techniques and ideas. Where can you find it? Online or offline or both!

Visual Library / Experiences

Observe, sketch, study the world. Live life. You need life experience to create interesting art and stories, and a library of mental images to draw from.

SKILLS OF A FREELANCER

Free-lance: working for different companies at different times rather than being permanently employed by one company.

In addition to the skills of their trade, a freelancer needs to develop:

Communication Skills

Interacting with clients & others.

Productivity Skills

Managing your time well, choosing how to focus and structure your day, meeting deadlines.

Marketing Skills

Finding new work opportunities; networking and promoting your business using online & offline methods.

Teamwork Skills

Working well with clients and other freelancers on collaborative projects.

Basic Financial Skills

Pricing, estimating, budgeting, billing, accounting, doing taxes.

Entrepreneurial/Leadership Skills

Identifying what you have to offer and how it fits into the industry; making short- and long-term choices that set direction for your business.
